



Southwire SAG10 Now Works on Windows Vista

There are several different versions of Windows Vista but they all contain a feature called User Account Control (UAC). Microsoft Support is quoted in saying; "Please understand that Windows Vista provides a new feature called User Account Control (UAC) for computer security. With UAC enabled, the lowest privilege is assigned to users. We need to elevate the privilege level when performing administrative functions. By doing this, unintentional operations can be prevented to protect the system." The unintentional operations do include any third party software. Southwire SAG10 is a third party application that is being blocked by the UAC. Microsoft Support is again quoted in saying; "The UAC implementation protects us from any unintentional actions by other users. Therefore, if you are the only user of the computer, we can turn off UAC with no risk. In another words, we can turn off the UAC to use the third party application." With this being said, we can easily turn off UAC in Windows Vista to allow SAG10 to run correctly.
